### Obituary for Ada Lou King

Memorial services for Ada Lou King, 71, of Roswell will be held at 2 pm Tuesday, Jan. 23, 2007, at Anderson-Bethany Funeral Home with Jan Killingsworth officiating. Ada passed away Friday, Jan. 19, 2007, at her home surrounded by the love of her family.

Ada was born on July 28, 1935 to James Monroe "Mon" King and Ruby Leona Blackburn in Clarksville, Arkansas. She received a Bachelor's degree in Biology at the College of the Ozarks and did graduate work at the University of Arkansas and Eastern New Mexico University. Ada taught six years outside RISD and twenty-nine years in the RISD at Pecos and Edgewood Elementaries, Roswell High in the Vocational Core for Potential Dropouts, and retired at Del Norte Elementary. She was named an Outstanding Educator for 1977-78 by the Roswell Optimist Club. Ada was a supporter of the Roswell Humane Society and CASA. She enjoyed playing bridge, and made a difference in the lives of her many students.

Ada is survived by her sister, Sandra L. Morris; nieces, Leslie Guise and Misty Morris all of North Little Rock, AR; great nieces, Kristin Morris of Colorado Springs, CO and Maya and Sabrina Johnson of Little Rock, AR; great nephews, James Lattin and Armando Hernandez Jr., of North Little Rock, AR; numerous cousins; and a host of friends.
