



Bill Walton Flynt, II

July 25, 1943 - June 7, 2016

Bill Walton Flynt, II, was born July 25, 1943, in Kermit, Texas, (per his parents- so he could be born a Texan) and lived in Jal, NM, and Wilcox, AZ, before moving to El Paso, TX, during his high school years. Bill graduated from Irvin High School in 1961. Bill passed away at home on June 7, 2016, he was 72 years old.

Bill worked for NCR Corporation for 32 years until a companywide retirement was mandated for employees 50 and over. He worked part time for the Roswell Daily Record for 19 years as Business Review Editor. Retiring in 2013, he continued his love of photography into retirement.

While in training for NCR, he met the love of his life in Dayton, Ohio. They met in March 1965, and were married on April 17, 1965. Starting their married life together at Clovis, NM, and moving to Roswell in 1969, for the second time.

Bill and his wife bought their first hot air balloon and it was the 23rd balloon in NM in 1974. Bill received his commercial license in 1974. The Flynt's owned four balloons during their ballooning life and retired from owning a balloon in 2006, still going out with friends to fly. Bill's love of photography and balloons were well known and appreciated. When the Smithsonian opened the Air and Space Museum, Bill's photo of the Albuquerque Balloon Fiesta was asked to be one of the exhibits. Bill was also one of the photographers for the Balloon Federation of America's Ballooning Journal. Bill studied and loved

photographing Hummingbirds and Dragonflies, becoming well known for his programs for local clubs on each.

Bill was a member/treasurer of the Photographic Arts Society of Roswell and Friends of Bitter Lakes Serving as president. Bill and Suzi were part of the original members of the Old Timer's Balloon Rally for the first 25 years. They were also members of the Wool Bowl Committee prior to the Old Timer's Balloon Rally. During the course of their balloon ownership, he gave many rides and programs to people interested in lighter than air.

Bill is preceded in death by his parents; Bill Walton Flynt and Virginia Love West Flynt; grandparents; sister, Virginia Flynt Howard Smith and his daughter, Gigi Flynt.

Bill is survived by his wife, Suzi of the home; son, Trey of Albuquerque; and sisters: Kathy Read of El Paso, TX; Patricia Dee and Danny of Amarillo, TX; Judy and Chuck Hammond of Lansing, KS; and nieces and nephews: Heather (Will) Elias; Tamer (Ryan) Bell; Tim (Angela) Baylor; Gena (Allan) Law; Joe (Laura) Hammond and Caryle (Joe) Bakian; and great nieces and nephews.

Per Bill's wishes, he will be cremated. A gathering of family and friends for Bill's memorial service will be Saturday, June 11, 2016, 2:00 PM at the Anderson Bethany Funeral Home Chapel.

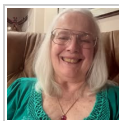

I was a pre-teen (9 or 10) & we went to balloon fiesta in Alberquerque.
