On September 20, 1980, David Ray was born to Jim and Paula Montoya in Roswell, where he attended school at Chisum Elementary, Mt View Middle, and Roswell High School. He was not only wise but also blessed with many other talents beginning at a very young age. David discovered his love for music and was a talented young performer, starting his performances at home for his family and friends, popping out from behind the curtains as we echoed 'Here's David!' it was in the same manner that Johnny Carson would come out on stage. Even at the age of 3, he knew that was what he was good at because he had everyone's attention. His first public performance was at the

age of 9, singing at the top of his lungs the song "Angel Baby," which he learned word for word from his sister, who spent days practicing to perfection. After that, with each performance, David fell more in love with singing and continued performing. He was our baby brother, with the voice of an angel, and indeed a gift from God! David continued to sing and was invited to sing for several city celebrations, singing alongside Bobby Villegas, a local musician, and mariachi, who continuously encouraged David to pursue his talents. David was being recognized and encouraged by everyone he met, including the director of the Roswell Folklorico, Frank Herrera. Frank invited David to sing for one of the recitals, and soon after that performance, David joined the dance group. He was dancing and singing to his heart's content and loved every minute of it. He danced for several years into his early 20s. He made so very many special, long-lasting friendships and made memories that he has always held close to his heart and treasured. While attending Roswell High, David always did exceptionally well in his studies. He was even invited to visit the White House. David was our go-to IT connection, our encyclopedia, our dictionary, and seemed to have all the answers at any given time, sometimes more than we wanted to know. He loved learning and reading about everything under the sun. He was our brainiac with a song in his heart. It was no surprise to us when David joined the choir at Roswell High; he was also a member of a group called the Roadrunners and Cyettes, which comprised of a few chosen choir members who also performed throughout the city. They spent countless hours performing together and had become very close. David loved high school and his choir group so much that after high school, he and a few of his choir buddies formed their own group called 'Zia Harmonies,' specializing in Val o grams, birthdays, and other special occasions, serenading special moments for each occasion.

The relationships he made while doing what he loved are a tribute to the man he was and was to become. He knew that God had blessed him, and he used every opportunity to shine, even when he made mistakes. He knew that God

was his salvation. David's infectious smile, his outgoing personality, his humor, and his genuine love of everyone are his legacy. David radiated love from his soul.

In 2006, David gave his entire heart to Jesus and was baptized and dedicated as a faithful disciple of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints.

Following his baptism, David traveled to Canada and began his Missionary training. He served his mission in Montreal, Trois Rivieres, and Mont Saint Hillaire in Quebec, Canada, where he served alongside his elders and other missionaries from around the world, all with the purpose of serving God.

David had grown in his faith so much that it was exuding from his very being.

We believe that he was put on earth to share the word of our Lord Jesus Christ, and he did. He began teaching and leading his family in Prayer as often as he could. During the pandemic, David led his family from near and far through daily virtual prayer meetings. David's unwavering desire to serve God as a faithful disciple was evident in everyone whose life he touched.

David's journey through life was not always easy, though, especially after his illness. Still, he continued to strive for God's purpose for him. With God's grace and mercy, David completed his studies, graduating with honors as an undergraduate in medical billing and coding. 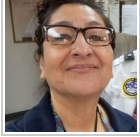
