Dennis was born on May 20, 1943, in St. Louis, Missouri to Edward and Rosemary McDonald. Along with his siblings Noel, Raymond, Jerry, and Mary Kay, the family moved to Roswell, New Mexico where Dennis attended and graduated from St. Peter High School, class of 1962. He played basketball, worked a paper route, and was an active member of St. Peter Catholic Church. Dennis attended the New Mexico Military Institute his first year of college and went on to graduate from Eastern New Mexico University in Portales in 1965, majoring in Commercial Art. He enlisted in the United States Army National Guard and Army Reserve serving our country until he was honorably discharged in 1971. Dennis was an artist and entrepreneur, working for different sign shops and owning a few as well. He married Sue Lamon and raised their son, Joel McDonald, for a short time in Roswell before moving to Colorado Springs, Colorado where he resided for many years. Dennis' name is synonymous with hard work. He was also a perfectionist, leaving him very little free time. But when he did, he loved to paint and work with his hands. He loved fast cars and enjoyed tinkering in the garage. In his later years, Dennis rekindled his love with his high school sweet-heart, Sharon (Chewning)

McDonald. They were married on September 26, 2001, and resided in Colorado Springs, Colorado for 9 years before moving back to Roswell to retire and be closer to family. He stayed devoted to his family, loved his dogs, Seamus, Shotzi, and Bella, and enjoyed reading the newspaper and watching any sports game on TV. And let's not forget, he could eat a whole box of chocolate chip cookies! In the last ten years of his life he battled cancer, all while working and still taking care of his wife. He was small in stature but mighty strong in spirit. He was a God-fearing man that loved his family and friends unconditionally.

Dennis is preceded in death by his father, Edward McDonald; mother, Rosemary McDonald; brothers: Noel, Raymond, and Jerry McDonald; and wife, Sharon McDonald.
