Harold E Jones, born October 16, 1919 in Montcoal, WV to John and Kitty Jones, passed away August 14, 2010 at Roswell Regional Hospital.

He attended school and graduated from Morris Harvey College, now Charleston University, and then Duke University Graduate School of Divinity. He served six years in the army and was a 2nd Lieutenant.

Harold was a Minister of the Iowa United Methodist Conference, retiring there in 1984. He served churches in West Virginia, North Carolina and Iowa. After retirement, he served interim appointments at Dexter, NM, Roswell, NM and Galena, Kansas. Harold spent his life serving others.

In 1952, Harold married Marjorie Armentrout of Mt Nebo, WV. Also surviving are his daughters, Dr. Debra Studer of Urbandale, IA, Nina Lynn Young and her husband Larry of Tucson, AZ; grandchildren, Paul Studer of Urbandale, IA, Sean Studer of Urbandale, IA, Todd Young and his wife Helen and their children Grace and Broderick of Corralville, IA; one sister of Louisiana and many nieces and nephews in West Virginia.
