



Harry Garfield Wilcox, Jr.

February 1, 1947 - June 27, 2016

Attorney Harry Garfield Wilcox, Jr., 69, passed away on June 27, 2016, in Roswell, New Mexico. He was born February 1, 1947, in Alamogordo, NM, to Harry Garfield, Sr. and Virginia Wilcox.

Harry began working with the family business started by his father, Harry, Sr. called Wilcox Electric, which later became known as Apple Electric when they moved to Phoenix, Arizona. During this time, Harry attended Grand Canyon University to pursue Seminary studies. Harry later pursued a law degree attending Oral Roberts University. Harry later relocated back to New Mexico joining the District Attorney's office in Lincoln County. He then joined the Public Defender's office where he practiced for 4 years before moving to Australia. Harry also furthered his studies at Melbourne University and obtained his Master's Degree in Law. He was then accepted and admitted to the Victorian Bar as a Barrister. During this time, Harry enjoyed traveling, boating, fishing, skiing and various sports including golf, cricket and Australian rules football with his family. During Harry's early years, he participated in local Rodeo's as a bull rider. Harry, also being a musician and singer, formed his own band known as Children of the Night. He played music and recorded records with his uncle, Calvin Boles who operated Yucca records in Alamogordo, New Mexico.

Preceding Harry in death are his parents: Harry Garfield Sr. and Virginia Wilcox; ex-wife and mother of two of his children Felicia Barba Wilcox; and recently daughter, Candace.

Those surviving Harry's memory are his sons: Todd Holmes of Alamogordo, NM, Harry Wilcox III "Tres" of Roswell, NM, and Harrison Wilcox of Melbourne, Australia; Carolyn Wilcox (mother of Harrison) also of Melbourne, Australia, and his brother, Randy Wilcox of Farmington, NM.

A Memorial Service will be Thursday, July 7, 2016, 3:00 PM at Anderson Bethany Funeral home and Crematory in Roswell, NM. Harry's cremains will then be taken to Melbourne, Australia, to spend his eternal-life in one of the places he loved most.

“ Harry was a good friend and excellent mentor to me. He shaped me up into a criminal defense lawyer quickly, but I enjoyed the time we spent together talking about cases, the law, and broader issues of society and personal life so much it never even felt like work. He always had the greatest sense of humor about everything from the frivolously silly to even the darkest subjects. He had this way of putting everyone that spoke with him at ease with the slightest of grins and a little chuckle. It just felt like here we are, getting paid to talk about things we know, care about, and find endlessly amusing, and taking every opportunity to improve our craft and throw a wrench in the works. The hours spent with Harry in his office throwing ideas around will always be remembered in my heart as some of the best hours I ever worked. And the later trial acquittals that I saw him achieve for his clients, some of which were quite stunning, inspired me to seek the same in my own career.

There must be thousands of people, quite literally, that owe Harry a part of their life, and some lucky few among them who but for Harry's marvelous talent would be spending the remainder of their miserable days locked in a prison, instead of walking free. For the rest of the thousands, he saved them a term of years, a degree of reputation from ruin, a place of psyche kept safe from the dehumanization and brutalization of extended incarceration. When one adds together all these lives, pieces of lives, these dignities and minds, one finds the immeasurable impact of this man on the world.

My condolences go out to his surviving family members, I hope they know how much Harry will be missed and how much gratitude he is owed by so many.
