On July 1, 1964, Jimmy was born to Joseph Williams and Wanda Jean Parker in Roswell, New Mexico. He graduated from Roswell High School and attended the New Mexico Military Institute. He joined the U.S. Army in April of 1984, where he served in the 82nd Airborne Division until he was honorably discharged in February of 1990. Jimmy had an outstanding military career receiving many badges and medals, including an Army Achievement Medal and the Army Good Conduct Medal.

Throughout Jimmy's life, he had been a painting contractor as well as a truck driver. He loved everyone and had a great sense of humor, which always kept his family and friends laughing at his jokes. Jimmy had the gift of the gab and a joyful spirit that attracted everyone, including many lovely ladies. He was a generous and caring person who loved to bless others, these gifts of compassion were more than learned behaviors, they were characteristics of his nature and his heart for service.
