



Jose Guadalupe Tarin

November 21, 1932 - April 5, 2023

Jose Guadalupe Tarin, 90, passed away peacefully at his home surrounded by his loving family on Wednesday, April 5, 2023, in Roswell, NM.

On November 21, 1932, Jose was born to Agapito and Adela Tarin Jimenez in El Mulato, Chih, Mexico.

In 1957 he was baptized in the name of Jesus at the age of 25 and became a minister 2 years later in the Apostolic Assembly of Faith in Christ Jesus. At the time of his death, Rev Tarin had served the Lord for 65 years. During those 65 years, he was a church planter and started missions in Hobbs, Lovington, Hagerman and Artesia, NM.

Some of his favorite pass times was hanging out with his children and grandchildren, watching his granddaughters play softball, watching cowboy movies and reading his Bible. He also loved his chicharrones and asado. He composed 3 songs based on his experiences in his Christian walk. If you knew him well, you knew that he loved to joke around no matter the circumstances. He always had a joke for everything. He had a great commitment to supporting his grandchildren in their ministries. His passion was sharing the gospel with his neighbors and people he met. He was a great example of forgiveness and love. He also had numerous close friends in the church that he loved and always remembered during his conversations with

his family.

On July 9, 1960, he married the love of his life, Ruth Martinez Rivera and together they had 8 children: Sylvia Tarin of Las Vegas, NV; Javier Tarin (Veronica) of El Mirage, Az; Edgar Tarin (Jayme); Maricela Rosales (Corry) and Laura Tarin all of Roswell, NM.

He was “Grandpa” to Adriana Lara, Adrian Tarin, Jose Griego, Marena Tarin, Armando Rosales Jr., Nikko’Lett Rosales, Joseph Espinoza, Makayla Rosales, Alex Tarin, Christian Espinoza, Catarina Tarin, Alexia Ortiz, Aubrey Tarin, Makenzie Tarin, Eden Chavira, Analycia Tarin, Alayna Tarin, and Elijah Tarin.
