



## Josie Vigil

October 9, 1930 - February 16, 2007

Memorial services for Josie Cruz Vigil, 76, of Roswell will be held at 2 pm Thursday, Feb. 22, 2007, at the Kingdom Hall of Jehovah's Witnesses 1718 North Atkinson with Minister and Friend Alfonso Rodriguez officiating.
