Funeral services for Julia will be at 10 am Monday, June 9, 2008, at St. John's with burial to follow in South Park Cemetery. Julia passed away Wednesday, June 4, 2008, at her home surrounded by the love of her family.

Julia was born on May 26, 1920 to Florentino Lucero and Cesaria Abreyo Lucero in Encino, NM. She and Frank Jaramillo were married January 8, 1940; Frank preceded Julia in death. Frank, Julia and their family moved from Carlsbad to Roswell in 1965. Julia was a very loving, caring and giving person ready to help in any task her eyes could see. At many funerals in the family, she was the sergeant and was good at giving her orders. She was a member of St. John the Baptist Catholic Church, the Senior Circle, and the Joy Center.
