Services: Memorial services will begin with a viewing at St Peter's Catholic Church, 111 E. Deming, Roswell, NM, on Thursday, February 7, 2019, from 9:30 AM to 11:00 AM. A rosary and Celebration of Life Service will begin at 11:00 AM, with a graveside service to follow at General Douglas L. McBride Veterans Cemetery adjacent to South Park Cemetery.

"Lolly" was born October 30, 1961, in Roswell, NM, to Grace Zamora Gutierrez and William "Willie" Gutierrez. As a youth, "Lolly" excelled in many of the athletic sports he participated in and was considered a phenome by area coaches and athletic officials. The Boys Club of Roswell offered him many sporting and social activities to help develop and mold his interests. Eventually, "Lolly" focused on baseball and football - where he would become known as the "Homerun King of Eastside" and the "Hindenberg" on the football line of scrimmage. He carried his successful athletic achievements

into high school graduating from Roswell High School in 1979, as an outstanding baseball player.

Upon graduation, "Lolly" enlisted in the United States Marine Corps and retired at the rank of Staff Sergeant with a specialty in personnel management. He received the following honors: Navy Achievement Medal, Joint Meritorious Unit Medal, Navy Unit Commendation w/2*, Meritorious Unit Commendation w/3*, Good Conduct Medal w/4*, National Defense Service Medal, Sea Service Deployment Ribbon, Meritorious Mast (3), Certificate of Commendation, Certificate of Appreciation (2), Letter of Appreciation (8), Desert Storm/Desert Shield Medal.

Shortly after enlistment in the Marine Corps, "Lolly" proposed to and married his high school sweetheart, Sandra Carrillo. Together they traveled the world and country as they moved to locations in California, Arizona, North Carolina, and Japan. During their time as a service family, "Lolly" and Sandra were blessed with two wonderful children: son, Jason Zamora; and daughter, Jennifer Zamora.

When "Lolly" retired from the US military, he and his family returned home to Roswell, NM, where he held various positions in financial advising, sales, and human resources. While attending ENMU-R, he also served as a baseball coach at Roswell High School and NMMI. "Lolly's" passion for serving the youth of the community led him to volunteer as a coach or board member for such organizations as the Boys and Girls Club, Eastside Little League, National Youth Sports Association, National Federation of State High School Association, Character Counts, and Hit, Pitch and Run contest. Most important to him was his sense of fair play and opportunity for all youth to pursue their dreams in life through athletics, that was what prompted "Lolly" to become involved and dedicated to a call to professional officiating and fair play. He was a member of the New Mexico Activities Association, the New Mexico Officials Association, and a Triple Play Umpire for NAIA Junior

Colleges, and NCAA.

During "Lolly's" commitment to his community he served as Hispano Chamber of Commerce Interim Director, was a Leadership Roswell participant, and currently was serving as Roswell Sertoma Club — Secretary, Mt. West Regional Sertoma — Governor, and founding member of the Caring for All Foundation.

Lolly came from a humble background, yet from a simple beginning Lolly produced an abundant harvest, God granted him much fruit. God asks us to be sowers of good seed. Like the sower who plants a mustard seed and yields a bountiful harvest, Vidal, too, sowed seeds that resulted in many acts of service to his community, to his country, and to his family. He met the first two commandments, the most important ones - love God and love your neighbor.
