Loman Trevor Bell passed away on Friday, May 12, 2017, in Dexter, NM. A Memorial Service will be held at Anderson Bethany Funeral Home Chapel on Friday, May 19, 2017, 2:00 PM. While in the US Air Force, he received several honors and medals and was ranked Master Sergeant (E7). Trevor went to the Persian Gulf War in 1991 and was most proud to serve in the US Air Force. Trevor enjoyed drone flying, electronics and gunsmithing. He loved the outdoors, camping and 4 wheeling. Although he is no longer with us, Trevor's memory will live on in his family and all the friends he has left behind.

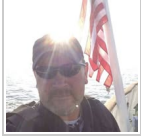
