July 23, 1918 - April 2, 2008

Louetta Mae Scott, 89, joined her Lord and Savior on April 2, 2008. She was born to John and Rosetta Spray July 23, 1918 in Sioux City, Iowa.

She was preceded in death by her parents, two brothers, Bud and Averil J. "Cy" and one sister, Gertrude Bennet.

Louetta is survived by two brothers, Howard and his wife, Dolores, and David and his wife, Marilyn; one sister, Charlene Gentile and her husband, Pete; her husband, of sixty-five years, Albert E. Scott; and one son, James M. Scott, both of Roswell.

Louetta married Albert E. Scott on June 15, 1943 in Sioux City, Iowa. They moved to Roswell in 1953 with their son, James. She served several years on the area Council of PTA, serving as president for the last year (1964). The council and the school presented "Living Pictures" in which they produced children in settings portraying a number of famous paintings and statues.

During the Vietnam War, she organized the accumulating of clothing to go to the villages in Vietnam, more than a ton of clothing was shipped, and Louetta received a letter of thanks from the Mayor.

Louetta was always active in the work of her church in Sioux City and in Roswell. She worked with children and with young teens, always sang in the choir, arranged or helped to arrange special parties and special occasions. She was a happy person, devoted Christian, loved to have fun and hear and tell jokes. She will be greatly missed.

Memorial services for Louetta Mae Scott will be held on April 12th at 10:00

a.m. at the Central Church of the Nazarene, 901 E. Country Club Road in Roswell with Pastor Randy Elftman officiating.
