Lucinda was a member of St. Peter's Catholic Church.

Lucinda passed away peacefully at her home in Roswell, NM on January 9, 2010 at the age of 93. She will be greatly missed by Manuel, her husband of 64 years; son, Michael, and his wife, Joan of Roswell; one sister, Dolores Trujillo of Maxwell, NM; one granddaughter, Tanya Johnson, and her husband, Richard of Roswell, and one grandson, Josh Martinez of Ruidoso, NM; she is also survived by many nieces, nephews, great-nieces and great-nephews.

Mom was preceded in death by one daughter, Sharon, one son, Marty, and one grandson, Patrick who was raised by her from infancy. We know they were all waiting to welcome her into heaven with open arms.

Lucinda was born March 19, 1916 to Daniel Sandoval and Lucia Torres in Chico, NM where her parents were cattle ranchers and sharecroppers in the Maxwell tract area. She was the sixth child of eight sisters and one brother. Growing up she accompanied her older sisters who had earned their teaching certificates to various northern New Mexico rural communities. She graduated from Kiowa High School in 1939 and worked for two years as a caregiver/

housekeeper in Raton, NM.

On November 28, 1945, she married Manuel R. Martinez in Springer, NM and lived in Clayton, NM for two years when Manuel moved his family to work for W.B. Lum Plumbing and Heating in Roswell in 1948. Lucinda spent her remaining life as a devoted loving wife and mother to her family.
