She sang as a soloist and choir member in churches and singing groups in Washington and the surrounding areas. Upon moving with her husband and family to Roswell in 1978, she continued to sing in area churches and choruses until ill health made practicing and singing for any period of time extremely difficult. After 2001, she was unable to sing because of compromised mobility.

Her working career included employment at Kitt & Jordan Music, in Washington, the Royal Embassy of Thailand, the Department of Agriculture, the Drug Enforcement Administration and the Federal Aviation Administration. She was married to her husband, Lionel, on June 30, 1968. They were together for 40 years. She was a wife, friend, and soulmate to her husband, a devoted and loving mother to her children and a friend to all she met and knew.

Before becoming ill, she attended church often. She loved her Lord and Savior. She joyfully took his hand, walking once again, to sing a heavenly chorus with the angels.
