Naomi Ellen Brady of Roswell passed away on September 7, 2011. A private service will be held at a later date. She was 74. She was born January 27, 1937 in Minco, Oklahoma, one of twelve children born to Jesse James Yingling and Lillie Hacker Yingling. She moved to Roswell as a girl with her family, and was a resident of Roswell for most of her life. Naomi met her future husband, North Carolina native Harold P. "Bill" Brady while he was stationed at Walker Air Force Base in the early 1950s. They were married April 14, 1954 in Carlsbad NM. Naomi was a wonderful homemaker and mother to her children, and she liked to sew, especially quilts and clothes. She was a great cook and loved the simple things in life: children, animals, her home, and Coca Cola. She had a terrific sense of humor. She worked at 7-11 in both Ruidoso and Roswell for several years in the 1970s, where she enjoyed her job and meeting people.
