“ Dear Dorothy, Betty, Jerry, Mondo, Chilo and Dina, Remembering Nicky As you know - I have known Nick Garcia and the Garcia's my whole life. I was born 11.2.61, and Nicky, much older and wiser was born 2 years earlier. It was so cool that Nicky was blessed to share his birthday with Jesus. Having the Garcia's live 2 houses away, was a full life all in itself. For some reason, being close in age made our parents think Nicky and I were a “match” and they never let us forget it. Especially your dad the teasing was relentless, causing Nicky and I to spend most of our life avoiding each other. Nicky was a quiet one, and I was not. Yet life kept weaving our families together. Delphi was one of my mom's best friends. Dorothy is like my sister. I spent a lot of time at the Garcia's, soaking in the laughter, Spanglish, love and yes, the relentless teasing. One of my most vivid memories with Nicky was when we were teenagers. Nicky was already working hard, managing employees at Furr's Cafeteria while still in high school. At Christmas, there was a big employee Christmas party, and for reason, I'll never understand, Delphi and Mom decided it would be a wonderful idea if Nicky took me as his “date.” Neither of us was thrilled. In fact we said NO WAY. He was Dorothy's brother to me, and I was just Dorothy's pesky friend to him. But our families had made up their minds. When Dad (who was feared) came into my room and told me to get dressed up for my ‘date’. I was in shock – I mean the kind of shock that caused snowball fights in hell. The kind of shock that had pigs start flying. This date was gonna happen and we didn't stand a chance. Nicky showed up in a suit, drove the two houses to pick me up, and we argued about whose fault this was during our drive to Furr's. Once we arrived, I continued to be in shock because Nicky was an absolute gentleman. He insisted on opening the car door for me. FIRST, he asked me to take his arm and when I rolled my eyes at him then he TOLD me to take his arm, and he treated me with respect all evening. At the party, I realized just how much fun it was to be around him. He was funny, kind, and easy to be around. His coworkers admired him deeply, not only as a manager but as their friend. Nicky and I knew each other's families so well and we worked well as a team -telling stories about our childhood, from 5

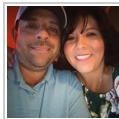
cents for the Ice Cream truck, to walking to Sanchez's for a penny candy. We even taught a few people the words to Hey Hey we're the Monkees song. I am going on record here...we were the 'HIT' of the party! By the time we drove home, we were back to our usual—arguing about whose fault the “date” was and blaming each other for being bossy or difficult. He dropped me off at the curb – no door opening here it was back to normal. He went 2 doors down to his house, and life went on. But when I speak with Dorothy to catch up – this is how I remember Nicky. It showed me who Nicky really was. He was a leader, a gentleman, and someone who carried quiet strength and humor with him. Over the years, life carried us all in different directions. I've watched this family endure so much losing your father Joe way too soon, watching Walter Cronkite each night during Vietnam for possible news of Henry, Danny, or Chilo, saying goodbye to Delphi too early, and later to Sonja, Henry, Danny, and now Nicky. My heart breaks for you. But today I want to hold on to gratitude. Gratitude that Nicky is no longer in pain. Gratitude for the memories. Gratitude for that Christmas “date” that gave me a glimpse of the wonderful man he truly was until his last breath. Nicky will be remembered as a husband, a wonderful son, brother, leader and a friend. I am thankful for having known him, and I'll always cherish the laughter, kindness, and heart he brought into this world. Rest in peace, Nicky; share your birthday cake with Jesus, give Sonja, Dephi, Joe, Henry, and Danny a hug, Sing 'Hey Hey we're the Monkee while your dad plays harmonia. Love Bernice

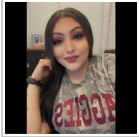
