



## Patricia Mobbs Mitchell

May 21, 1925 - September 6, 2009

Patricia Ruth Mobbs Mitchell, 84, died at home in Roswell on Sunday, September 6. Suffering from brain cancer, she had been in hospice care for less than a month before her death. Pat was born on May 21, 1925 in Montpelier, Vermont, to Earl and Ruth Mobbs. She and one younger brother, Richard Mobbs, grew up in Springfield, Massachusetts, where she graduated from high school during World War II. Upon graduation, she postponed college to join the war effort, working in the drafting department of the Bosch Company designing mechanical parts for airplanes. In 1946, she married Roswell native, Franklin Mitchell, who was serving in the military in Springfield. After the war, they relocated to Roswell, where Franklin joined his family's business. During her 63 years in Roswell, Pat was employed by a variety of businesses that reflected her aptitude for artistic design and craftsmanship. Over the years, she was employed by Avenue Interiors, Carrielle's Fine Fabrics, and The Art Barn, and retired after serving over 20 years as manager of Two Squaws, specializing in high-end Native American jewelry and art. Pat is survived by a son, Mike Mitchell of Oklahoma City, a daughter, Barbara Stagner of Houston, a grandson, David Mitchell of Dallas, a granddaughter, Emily Stagner, of Houston, and one great granddaughter, Alexandra Mitchell, of Dallas. She was preceded in death by her parents, and brother, and her husband of 63 years, Franklin Mitchell, who died in August. Pat was buried in the Mitchell family plot at South Park Cemetery on Thursday, September 10, following a private graveside service. In keeping
