When we met them, they would say they felt as if they knew us already because of the stories they had heard about us. We knew that meant she loved us and was very proud of us.

Our Mom was tiny but mighty and definitely not someone you'd want to cross, but she had a huge heart with so much love to give. The family was very important to her, but so was her job. Phylis worked at Quality Inn and Suites

as a manager for many years. She was a devoted employee who went above and beyond for her staff and hotel owner. The hotel was truly her home away from home, and she loved everyone there, and they loved her.

Our Mom was truly a fighter in every sense of the word. Cancer reared its evil head in her life, and she was diagnosed with stage 3b lung cancer 7 years ago. Given only a 5% chance of survival and only a year to live, she set out to battle this demon. Chemotherapy, radiation, and losing all her hair didn't slow her down. Against all the odds and far beyond the expectations of the doctors, she was cancer-free! We were in awe of her strength and determination through this battle; in the end, it was her COPD and respiratory failure that took her from us.
