Dick was a loving family man and when he met Lynn and her kids in 1975, they soon wed. As a family they spent nearly 45 years making joyous memories.

Dick worked many years in the oilfield services, which had him traveling all over the world including Australia, England, and Egypt. He even introduced a group of Welshmen to their first American hotdog. He enjoyed his work and travel, but couldn't wait to get home to his family where he played all kinds of board and card games, and taught his kids to play basketball and softball. Later in life, Dick owned and operated his own oil well completion company working and making friendships all over the Permian Basin. When Dick

decided to retire, he enjoyed his golden years playing “Friday Night Skip-Bo” for pennies with his wife, sister in-law, and brother in-law, where the boys’ cheating left their penny jar empty.

Dick was proud of his grandchildren and loved spending time with them. He and Lynn would take their grandkids camping and traveling in the RV creating special memories the kids have cherished. Dick’s hobbies included riding and taking care of his mules and donkey, target shooting, reloading his own ammo, binge watching his old cowboy movies, taking his dogs for rides on the back roads, kicking rocks at Boy Scout Mountain with his kids and grandkids, people watching at the mall while the girls shopped, and his favorite; being ornery and picking on his loved ones. Dick was friendly and easy going, never meeting a stranger, but instead making a friend for life. In his 77 years, he has touched many lives and will be missed dearly by all.

Dick was preceded in death by his father and step-mother Roy L. and Mickey Prescott, mother and step-father, Inez and Bob Beck, daughter Trish Prescott, brothers Roy Harlan Prescott and Raymond Garlan Prescott.
