



## Ronald Allensworth

May 20, 1928 - September 21, 2011

R.C. "Speedy" Allensworth, 83, passed away peacefully on September 21, 2011.

R C was born in Oklahoma City on May 20, 1928, the youngest of 12 children, to James Franklin and Ethel Afensene Allensworth. R C. moved to Roswell with his family when he was 5 years old, living in a half dugout by Bottomless Lakes until they were able to build a house and dig a well on a small acreage in Midway. They later built another house on Delaware street and he helped his dad dig the well. He attended LFD School in East Grand Plains. He broke horses and took care of the horses at NMMI. He later drove trucks and rodeoed. He owned his own trucking business. His greatest joy was training race horses, which he did for many years. He trained quarter horses for himself and many people. When asked what he was doing or where he was going, his usual response was "tending to business". When asked at the age of 80 how he wanted to be remembered, he said, "I was wild as a peach orchard boar and a pretty good windmill man. I can die a happy man. My kids are doing fine."

He is preceded in death by his parents' and 10 siblings. He is survived by a brother, Elbert Allensworth of Roswell; Children Ross Allensworth and Ronald Allensworth of Roswell; Kenneth Allensworth and his fiancée Suzanne Trease of Wichita, Kansas; Laura and Donnie Wood of Spring Hill, Tennessee; and Tracy McMahan Allensworth of Portland, Oregon; and grandchildren Chance Wood, Kyle McMahan, Clayton Allensworth and Colbey Wood.
