Vilis A. (Bill) Sauskis, 89, passed on Saturday, December 21, 2019, peacefully at his home. He was born to Peter and Julija Sauskis on December 9, 1930, in Elksni, Lavita, Europe. Vilis and his family immigrated to the USA in 1950, sponsored by the Catholic Church. Bill entered the USA Airforce and was stationed at Walker Airforce Base in Roswell, New Mexico. He met the love of his life, Aneda (Ann) Savedra from Tinnie, New Mexico. Bill and Ann married on February 11, 1956, and made their home in Roswell. Their union lasted sixty-three years and brought them, three daughters. Mary Ann, Aina, and Kathryn.

Bill was a jack of all trades and a masterful mechanic. He could fix anything or break it beyond recognition. He had a long career as a Mechanical Tech. Bill worked eighteen years for Desmond Ford. He then retired after twenty years with Transwestern Pipeline Company. Bill was fortunate to retire at the age of fifty-five, so he and Ann went fishing. They spent many wonderful years at Lake Amistad with lots of close friends. Bill liked to hunt, fish, camp, grow his pecans, peaches, and tomatoes. He always had a project and we loved his unique repairs. Dad taught us all how to take care of things from the school of hard knocks. . . a true Man's Man.
