Wendell Glenn Tyler, 57, of Midway passed away Monday, December 31, 2007. He lost his ten year long battle with heart disease in a Lubbock, Texas hospital.

He was crazy about playing dominoes and was a tough domino foe with his family and friends. Glenn's absolute favorite hobby

of all was reading, especially western novels by Louis L'Amour and Zane Grey. He was a Pentecostal and gave his life to Jesus and is in heaven waiting for us.

A memorial service for Glenn will be held at 2 pm Friday, Jan. 4, 2008, in the One-Eighty Building at Church on the Move. Glenn was cremated as were his wishes.
