On July 26, 1949, William Richard Scott was born to Lawrence Scott and Rosa Wright Scott in Roswell, NM. He attended Roswell High where he graduated. He enlisted in the US Navy. During the time he was serving his country in 1969 – 1973, he received three metals in Yokasakama, Hong Kong, Dawang, Hawaii, aboard US Vancouver, returning to Minneapolis, Maryland for the rest of his service.

He married Judy Scott on November 22, 1968, in Roswell, NM. He was a lifetime member of CCSP. Prior to retirement William Richard Scott worked for a vending mechanic, painter, Pepsi Cola, owned and operated car wash Flashy Car Wash, owned and operated J and R Rides for 13 years.
