On May 2, 1945, Willie Leo Burnes was born to Opal Marie and Alex Lester Burnes in Porum, Oklahoma. He attended school at Washington Avenue and High School at Roswell High in Roswell, New Mexico. Willie was a master at moving homes and buildings. He was up before the sun and off to work, which kept him out of town most of the week. Willie worked whether it was raining, snowing, or the sun was beating down on him. Those houses were turned into homes for many families in regions across New Mexico and the surrounding States for many years. His stories about his profession regaled many with the dangers that happened on the job as well as the funny things that happened in his daily life. Willie later worked for Chaves County Road Department for 15 years. He built, welded, and installed many of the Cattle Guards in and around Chaves County. He also maintained vehicles for the County. Willie was

awarded many awards during his years of service. He met his partner Katherine Ruth Keene on June 22, 1995, while working at the County. They melded their families into one big loving family.

Willie was a Believer in God and had a personal relationship with the Heavenly Father. His favorite Christian songs were "Just A Closer Walk With Thee," "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder (I'll be there)," and "One Day at a time." He supported many people over the years with friendship and love. Willie and Kathy were delighted to help family and friends fix items in and around their homes. They traveled to Albuquerque frequently to help a friend when she was sick loving and supporting her until she passed away; this was their ministry. He was a man who always put others before himself.
